Middle Years Students Learning Journey Update

As previously reported in our newsletter, our 8th and 9th graders are the pioneers of our school. They have always been the oldest students in school, paving the way for those in the lower grade levels. To help them to envisage their educational pathway, we held two sessions with them before the Easter break, which focused on the Middle Years (MYP) and Diploma Programmes (DP) on offer at BaSICS and ISS Degerloch.

Rebecca Jones-Bürk (BaSICS Director of Academics) led a session with 8th and 9th graders, describing the structure of the International Baccalaureate, Middle Years Programme and how it leads to the choices for the Diploma programme.

Mary-Jane Martin (Degerloch High School Principal) and Matthias Krusch (Degerloch Middle School Principal) then worked with the 8th and 9th graders on a Tuesday afternoon, to further develop the profile of a middle school student and the transition from Middle School to High School expectations for learning.

Our students particularly raised questions about the similarities and differences between both campuses concerning home learning assignments and time (very similar expectations), if subject areas are the same (they are), if the students at Degerloch really know about BaSICS (they do not, therefore, information sessions are being planned to raise awareness of Degerloch students about BaSICS, as well as invite Degerloch students to spend the day at BaSICS), and will the preparation steps for choosing courses to study in grades 11 and 12 be the same (they will). Our students are also interested in meeting and talking to current grade 11 students at Degerloch to get a better idea of "life in the IB and ISS Diploma Programmes." We'll be arranging this, too, for times in May. We'll also carry out the additional initiatives as described in previous newsletter articles.

Please also find the International Baccalaureate Programme MYP and DP flyers on our portal site. These were given to our students and contain general information about both programmes.

We are looking forward to the return of our grade 8 and 9 students next week. Both classes are currently out on field trips. Grade 8 has gone to a science research center in the Netherlands to investigate habitats, and Grade 9 is near Almeria, Spain, on an exchange trip visiting the students who were here with us in February. There will be more to read about these two field trips in upcoming newsletters.
