Science News

Dear Parents,

If you are looking for a good science excursion sometime, I highly recommend:

Experimenta (Hands-On Science Museum near the center of Heilbronn) - roughly an hour from the school.

Students of all ages (including adults) will enjoy interacting with the exhibits that cause you to think and ultimately learn about the world we live in. With my family we visited the museum for 3 hours, but we could have spent all day. There is a "Biergarten" next to the museum with a small water playground that we also enjoyed.

Students from the 8th grade will particularly appreciate the large section on Energy Resources and those from the 6/7th will also enjoy the rocket that is powered by igniting hydrogen -- created by separating the elements of water using electrolysis!! There is also a large section on communication (body language, technology, speaking languages...) and an indoor "science playground."

Secondly, in Winterthur, Switzerland (approx. 2 hours from the school), there is Technorama, a much larger and more expensive Science museum -- but definitely worth the money and drive. Here I would recommend visiting only if you have a full day. There is so much to see and do! There are shows, hands-on Physics experiments of all levels of sophistication and an outdoor physics playground. The science is at a higher level than at Experimenta, but younger elementary school children with the help of an older sibling or adult will also be able to learn from and enjoy the exhibits.
